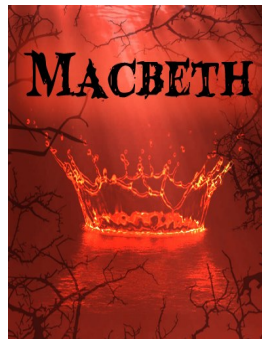
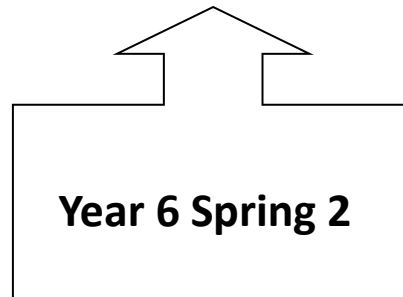
Starting point

Children will have a moral debate: How does power change things?

Big Issue

Children will be asked to think about power struggles and the influence of choice.

Text : Macbeth by William Shakespeare



English

Discuss the moral dilemmas raised by the themes in the text. Explore the language of the historical period and the effect on the reader. Writing will include a narrative and a formal closing statement.

Science - Evolution and Inheritance

Explore how living things have changed over millions of years. Understand that animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment. Recognise that living things produce offspring and that they vary from their parents. Ask relevant questions.

Geography

Explore the impact of physical and human factors on natural disasters around the World. Including climate change; volcanoes and earthquakes; economic activity; distribution of economic resources; impact on food and trade.
