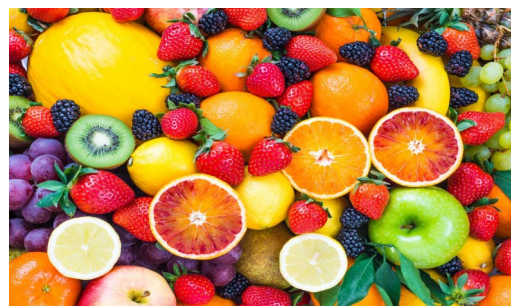

Writing

Children will learn to combine words into sentences and punctuate with a capital letter and full stop. Children will describe a new character and describe a setting. They will write an adventure story with an animal, based on the structure of 'Lost and Found'.

Science

Children will explore the human senses - identifying, naming, drawing and labelling the basic parts of the human body and saying which part of the body is associated with each sense.

Geography

Where do we come from? Children will be introduced to the world map and plot their family's origins and discuss travel, family history and purpose and use of maps.

RE

How do religions celebrate the birth of a baby?

Children will explore the concept of belonging through the study of birth ceremonies in Christianity, Islam and Sikhism.

RSHE

Being me in my world. Children will learn about the rights and responsibilities for being a member of the class. They will also recognise the choices they make and understand the consequences.

This half term, the children are working towards achieving the target indicated below. The ultimate aim is for your child to be able to recall these facts instantly.

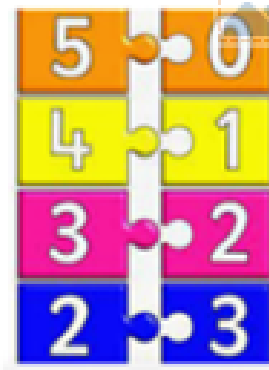
